Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Criminology and Justice Bridging program at the University of Ontario Institute of Technology (UOIT)

The University of Ontario Institute of Technology (UOIT) invites graduates of Ontario College Diploma programs in Police Foundations or Law and Security Administration who are interested in pursuing a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) degree in Criminology and Justice to consider UOIT's new bridging program.

Admission requirements: Graduates from any two- or three-year Ontario College Diploma in either Police Foundations or Law and Security Administration will be considered for admission to UOIT's Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Bridge program in Criminology and Justice.

General information: Students who successfully complete all four designated bridging courses with an overall "B" average will be eligible for the third year of a four-year Bachelor of Arts (Honours) degree program in Criminology and Justice at UOIT. Students are considered for admission into the main Criminology and Justice program or into the Police Studies or Correctional specializations.

Program curriculum: The Bachelor of Arts bridging program consists of the following four courses:

- » Quantitative Methods
- » Sociological Theories of Crime
- » Psychological Explanations of Criminal Behaviour
- » Research Methods

Upon successful completion of the Bridging program, students will be eligible to enter the third year of the Criminology and Justice program.

How to apply: Students may apply for a May or September start date through the Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC). All four bridging courses will be offered in the summer semester starting in May. Students wishing to enroll in September start should be aware that only two of the bridging courses will be offered in the fall and the two remaining will be offered in the winter semester.
